Summer Projects

The Maintenance & Operations Department will be working and overseeing contractors on multiple projects over the summer. Please be aware of the following projects which will be occurring and may impact staff on both campuses.

Painting

Various painting projects, primarily at the Kentfield campus including the Academic Center, PE Complex, SMN and Performing Arts Buildings will be starting on May 30.

Carpet and Floor Replacement

Carpets will be replaced in the Academic Center, Student Services, and Child Study Center. The PE Complex will have floor replacement in the locker rooms. The bulk of this work will happen between spring and summer term. We ask that you please pack or lock up any personal items during this time, especially for offices impacted. Further communication will be coming out by the first week of May.

Window Cleaning

Window cleaning will be taking place May 30 to June 9 for the Academic Center, Performing Arts and Student Services Buildings. All windows inside and out will be cleaned. If you have items taped to windows or items on window sills, please remove them by May 26 (Commencement). All windows will be stripped of all posters left behind, and tape will be scraped as well.

Learning Resources Center

Increment one of construction is moving along. This includes removal of dirt and debris from the site, grading, shoring, and foundation work. The final design drawings are making their way through the Division of State Architect (DSA) and Increment 2 work is expected to begin in the fall.

937/939 Sir Francis Drake Blvd. Properties

Kentfield Pool Deck

Drawings are complete and have been submitted to DSA for approval.

Bolinas Field Station

Happy spring! It is hard to believe it is April already and that spring is here because the weather has been so dreary but nevertheless, here we are and the sun is back! We hope everyone is having a good semester.

As we approach commencement, the days get increasingly busy in College Services with many design and print projects being created and produced to support all the wonderful events, programs and happenings at COM. It is also a very hectic time for Receiving with event and fiscal year end orders and needs so we thought it might be helpful to review what exactly Receiving is... and is not...

What Is Receiving?

The fancy explanation: The primary responsibility of College of Marin Receiving/Courier is to establish and implement procedures for the receipt, documentation and distribution of official college goods, materials, equipment and supplies in support of college-related functions.

But really -

Receiving/Courier is the primary point to receive, process, document, transport and redistribute all incoming material for COM. The Receiving Clerk/Courier also transports first class mail, print projects and other packages from Kentfield to IVC and back again each day.

When Is Receiving Open?

Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Receiving is not open on holidays or weekends. If you have deliveries arriving outside this window for any reason, please notify the Clerk as soon as possible or reschedule as required.

The Receiving Clerk is often out on the courier run between campuses or delivering packages. Most carriers are aware and arrangements have been made to accommodate deliveries. Please do not pick up packages that have been left at the loading dock as they must be scanned and cataloged prior to delivery. If you have an urgent request, please notify Receiving.

Please do not text Manny directly for requests as his day is very full and doing so runs the risk of your request not being received if he is on the road or on leave. aricciuti@marin.edu and we will do what we can to assist.

Orders and Ordering Tips

If you have large deliveries arriving at Receiving, please provide as much advance notice as possible, as well as tracking numbers, carrier and vendor info and any other relevant details. This will assist Receiving and help you get what you need more quickly.

When you place an order with Staples, Amazon or other vendors, please provide as many details on the order as possible, including the Purchase Order number, the contact for delivery, the Receiving address and any other identifying information.

Who Is Receiving?

A very recognizable and friendly face on campus serves as COM's Receiving Clerk – Manny Rodriguez! Manny and the Receiving Clerk position report to College Services, not Maintenance & Operations, though we work closely together. Manny has been with COM since 2018 and is always available to help with your needs.

Where Is Receiving?

Currently, Receiving is at 120 Kent Avenue in Kentfield. It will be moving this summer to the M&O warehouse so stayed tuned for details. For now, please use the 120 Kent address for all large deliveries via UPS, Fed Ex, Staples or other vendors. For orders being sent via the US Post Office, please use 835 College Avenue instead.

And ... What Receiving Is NOT

- Moving refrigerators/furniture
- Moving large amounts of boxes
- Moving tables
- Moving office equipment or furniture

- Moving classroom equipment
- Installing, assembling or unpacking equipment
- Picking up donations. personal items, and running errands
- Moving items to storage

If large items arrive via carrier, the Receiving Clerk will transport those items as soon as possible to their destination. However, once they arrive, future movement is not part of the responsibility of the Receiving Clerk.

Receiving Is Also Not Shipping

As a courtesy, the Receiving Clerk will pick up UPS or Fed Ex packages that are PRE-PAID and store those for pickup at 120 Kent. However, Receiving does not package or mail large packages, equipment or other items. Individual departments are responsible for making their own arrangements to send large items via UPS or Fed Ex. Shipping smaller packages or other items is available through College Services via US Mail but should be packaged and addressed. Supplies are available in College Services or at the Post office.

2023-2024 Budget Development

Fiscal Services is focused on budget development for the 2023-2024 fiscal year. Budget Managers should please reference the Memo sent on April 6 with key deadlines. The Tentative Budget will be presented to the Board of Trustees at the June 20 Board meeting, and the Adoption Budget will be presented to the Board of Trustees at the August 15 Board meeting. The Budget Builder tool is currently open for updates and updates must be completed by Budget Managers by Tuesday, May 16.

Signature Authority: Do You Have It?

Answer is probably not.

The District has a pre-defined set of guidelines in regards to signature authority within the District, most of which is reserved for members of the executive team, fiscal services, and a few select others due to the nature of their work. Signing something for the District that you do not have authority for can bind you to that contract, goods, or services personally. So please check the signature authority board resolution at the following link before you proceed.

Purchasing guidelines are also adopted by the Board of Trustees as not only guidelines but parameters in which we work every day for purchasing goods and services. You can find these items at the following <u>link</u>.

Fast Facts

- 3,264 Work orders 365
 (about 11.5%) of those were
 HVAC related
- The rest are a compilation of carpentry, gardening, electrical, custodial, locksmith, pools, pest control, and painting
- 22 pallets, or 1 full length semi truck, of paper towels or about 57 miles of paper
- 220 cases of jumbo toilet paper or over 2.7 million feet of paper or just under 500 miles
- Annually we bale and recycle approximately 12-14 tons of cardboard
- Annually we send about 432 cubic yards of material to compost, or 15 large roll off dumpsters

IT Services for Students

The IT Department has been working to improve technical support for our students and the community at-large.

Over the last couple of years, Nicholas
Calagias and Juan Pablo Izquierdo, two very capable students, have staffed the Library and the Writing Center at
Kentfield. They provide timely support by addressing a range of issues from printing to Wi-Fi as well as handholding other students through various computer tasks.

Their contribution has positively impacted student experience with technology and the IT Department is grateful to have them on our team. We hope Nicholas is able to continue with us next year while Juan Pablo has been accepted at San Francisco State for the fall term. Thanks to both of them for their outstanding work!

New Password Requirements

A recommendation from our last cybersecurity assessment is to adopt much stronger and safer account password guidelines. In order to meet these requirements, we are asking all our users, at their earliest convenience,

to reset their MyCOM/PC passwords.

The new passwords must meet the following conditions:

- 12 characters or more in length
- No personal or pets' names and dates (too quickly identified)
- No common names or dictionary words
- No sequences of more than 3 digits in a row
- Include at least one character from these 4 categories:
- Uppercase alphabet characters (A-Z)
- Lowercase alphabet characters (a-z)
- Base 10 digits (0-9)
- Non-alphanumeric characters
- 24 months rotation for password reset / expiration.

All password changes that occurred before March 2, 2023 will need to be reset again to meet the required higher level of complexity.

Data Security

The District received \$150K in state funding for Systemwide Technology and Data Security. This one-time state funding will support College of Marin's security health check assessment project as guided by the Chancellor's Office.
