Ask 10 students "What is race?" and you'll likely get 10 different answers. Few issues are as fraught with so many myths and misconceptions.

Join California Newsreel's Larry Adelman, the awardwinning Executive Producer of the film series "Race: The Power of Illusion," and COM professors Walter Turner and Bonnie Borenstein in a workshop and discussion about how to talk about human variation, the idea of race, and distinctions between race and racism. The workshop will offer some interactive exercises and introduction of a new website based on the film series, developed by U.C. Berkeley's Haas Institute for a Fair and Inclusive Society.

Faculty of all disciplines will find useful tools for developing assignments and information to help them navigate discussions about race and racism with students, in and out of the classroom, and ideas to assist in their pedagogical practices.

Copper Enameling Using Laser Cut Stencils: Incorporating New Technologies into Existing Curriculum

We are all encouraged to incorporate new technology into our teaching. This activity is an example on how we may augment our existing projects without the new medium overwhelming the existing curriculum, facilities and our students. In this workshop, we will attempt to merge old school with new school by melting colorful enamel designs onto copper forms using a kiln at 1350°F and torches. The designs will be made from stencils cut by our laser cutter. Traditionally these stencils would be painstakingly cut by hand, but the laser can produce detailed intricate patterns quickly and cleanly in a few minutes.
