




#### **Grand Opening of the Bolinas Field Station**

#### **Microsoft Email Quarantine**

This is a reminder that our Microsoft Quarantine spam filters may catch some legitimate emails. You will frequently receive an email from "quarantine@messaging.microsoft.com" with the following subject line: "Microsoft 365 security: You have messages in quarantine." To release, block the sender, or review the message, open that email and proceed as indicated.

## **Campus Police and Safety**


### Campus Police in the College Community

On March 5, Chief Aquilar was invited to speak with Professor Willow Barnosky's ESL Class. Chief Aguilar shared his story as an English learner and first-generation immigrant with the class. Chief Aguilar spoke about his journey of public service, from being an ESL student to becoming a police officer in Marin County and his different stops along the way to become the Chief of Police at College of Marin. In addition, Chief Aquilar spoke about the services the police department provides to the campus community, know your rights when encountering law enforcement and the fact that California police officers will not cooperate with immigration enforcement. At the end of the presentation, students had a chance to ask questions and were invited to contact the Chief with any questions or concerns.

Also on March 5, students from the Child Study Center visited the Police Department. The youngsters met Officer Schneider and his Field-Training Officer, Officer Stewart, and

our Police Service Assistant Jessica Shahi, who gave them a tour of the campus police office. The officers also showed their police vehicle and public safety equipment to the children. At the end, the students received "Junior Officer" stickers as a souvenir of their field trip.





## **Capital Projects**

#### **Center for Student Success**

We are pleased to share several key milestones and ongoing activities that have contributed to the project's successful progress. Here's an update on the work completed and what is currently underway:

- 1. Installation of Windows and Curtain Walls
- 2. Connection of Main Power to Building
- 3. Closing Interior Walls with Drywall Level 1
- 4. Installation of Exterior Scaffolding
- 5. Continued Nonstructural Framing on All Levels
- 6. MEP Rough-In Above Ceiling Level 1
- 7. Installation of Sheathing/Weatherproofing at Exterior of Building
- 8. Installation of Windows, Flashing, and Painting for Site Mock-Up
- 9. Installation of Interior Insulation at All Levels

As the project progresses, our focus has expanded beyond the physical construction and into the finer details that will shape the building's final environment. Ensuring that the new space is not only functional but also welcoming and efficient for its occupants is of paramount importance. This quarter, we've made significant strides in two critical areas: the selection of furniture and the planning of a seamless transition into the building.

The collaborative efforts with the District Furniture Committee to validate and select furniture have been pivotal in shaping the interior spaces. These discussions have not only focused on aesthetics but also on ensuring that the furnishings meet the diverse needs of those who will use the building daily. In parallel, our team has been diligently developing a move plan and schedule designed to ensure a smooth transition, prioritizing the continued operation of essential services for students while making the building ready for occupation

## Other Approved Projects

During the last quarter, the Board of Trustees made several important decisions future Measure B projects. Among the key actions taken, the board approved a number of allocations aimed at further enhancing our campus facilities and supporting continued growth and development

Budget Allocations for New Projects

The Board approved the allocation of budget funds to several new, impactful projects that will address critical needs across our campuses:

Performing Arts Fire Curtain Replacement - Fire curtain replacement at the theater stage. Design is through DSA and is currently out to bid. Construction to take place June 2026 with a completion date of August 2026.

PE Complex Renovations – Replacement of existing non-compliant bleachers, removal, repair, and replacement of existing pool deck and plaster and other associated ADA updates. Design is out to bid and construction is expected to begin in June, 2025 with a completion date of June 2026.
