Clarifying the Path: Create Clear Curricular Pathways to Employment and Further Education

- Drafting major "road maps" and will be working with academic departments to finalize for publication
- Creating course maps for the 21 UC majors to establish clearer transfer pathways
- Developing the Meta-Majors or Interest Clusters
- Developing and expanding Humanities 101
- Supporting departments in developing blueprints for course offerings



Entering the Path: Help Students Choose and Enter Their Pathway

- Strengthening pathways from high schools to COM through programs such as COMPASS, Summer Bridge, satellite classes
- Developing comprehensive program called Mapping Academic Pathways for Success (MAPS) to include learning communities, career exploration, peer mentoring, and internships
- Implementing multiple measures for English and math placement



Staying on the Path: Supporting Students on Their Path

- Providing ongoing and intentional counseling
- Tracking student progress
- Identifying students at risk
- Providing needed counseling and educational planning
- Redirecting students who are not progressing in a program to a more viable path




Ensure Learning:
