STUDENTS: COVID-19 Campus Procedures, Protocols, and Guidelines

What You Need to Know

College of Marin prioritizes the health and safety of our students, staff, and faculty. Information in this document has been drawn from local public health orders, the work of other colleges and universities, and perspectives from campus stakeholders. The final College of Marin COVID-19 Recommended Protocols and Procedures report will be posted to the COVID-19 Updates and Resources page.

Because information about COVID-19 is constantly evolving, students should regularly check their mycom.marin.edu email and/or marin.edu for updates about campus/class changes and protocols.

NOTE: If you need academic accommodations and support, contact Student Accessibility Services (SAS) at sas@marin.edu or (415) 485-9406. We recommend contacting SAS prior to the start of the semester.

Buildings and Facilities

- College of Marin facilities will remain closed to the public, with the exception of approved in-person classes (class schedule: https://netapps.marin.edu/Apps/Directory/ScheduleSearch.aspx).
- Entrances and areas on campus will be deemed *active* or *inactive*. *Active* areas will only be accessible during the scheduled class time to students who are registered for that specific class. *Inactive* areas are off limits to all students.
- Custodial crews will regularly clean classrooms and *active* public spaces based on protocols developed with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance.
- For in-person classes, contact your instructor(s) for the most accurate information about class access and expectations.

In-Person Classes

- Students are only permitted to be in an active class space during their scheduled in-person class meeting.
- Desks and workstations shall be safely distanced to adhere to county guidelines.
- Face coverings are always required when on campus, including but not limited to campus grounds, offices, classrooms, restrooms, elevators, stairwells, and hallways.
- Students must adhere to county physical distancing guidelines at all times: at least 6 feet apart.

Health and Safety

- Students taking in-person classes will be required to fill out and adhere to the Student Safety Agreement and must complete a Health Assessment Survey no more than 24 hours before every class visit.
- You will not be penalized for staying home if you are ill or self-isolating due to possible exposure. Consult
 with your health care provider if you are sick, have been exposed to COVID-19, or are diagnosed with COVID19.
 - Communicate with your instructor(s) if you are unable to attend class (in-person or online) due to illness or family obligations.
- If you are exposed to COVID-19 or diagnosed with COVID-19, follow medical instructions from your health care provider.
 - Any student who has been on campus within 14 days of a positive COVID-19 test should immediately self-isolate and contact <u>COM Student Health Services</u>.
 - Uninsured students with symptoms/concerns related to COVID-19 should call Marin County HHS at (415) 473-4163 or their county's public health department, and their questions will be routed to appropriate staff and health care providers.
