## Overview

College of Marin offers Community Education classes that are fee-based, short-term, not given for credit, and not graded.
The College offers Community Education classes in a wide variety of subjects such as art, foreign languages, computers, physical fitness and more areas.

The college serves about 2,200
Community Education students each term.
The enrollment for fall 2012 in the
Community Education program was 2,209 students.

## Gender

The College's Community Education student population is composed of $22 \%$ men and $77 \%$ women. One percent of students declined to answer the question.

## Geographic Origin

Most College of Marin Community Education students reside in Marin County (91\%). Of the remaining students, the majority come from San Francisco, the East Bay, and Sonoma County.

## Age of Students

Eighty-nine percent of College of Marin Community Education students are 30 years of age or older. The average age of students is 58 years. The youngest student is 13 and the oldest is over 80 .


## Ethnicity

Fifty-six percent of students self-report that they are white, $36 \%$ of students do not report the information, and nine percent self-report as minorities. The following chart indicates a breakdown of the groups.
