

Overview

College of Marin offers *community education* classes that are fee-based, short-term, not given for credit, and not graded.

There are a wide variety of subjects offered in the *community education* class schedule such as art, artisan cheese-making, computers, foreign languages, physical fitness and more.

These *community education* classes are offered during day, evening and Saturday hours. Please refer to the community education class schedule for a listing of classes or call 415.457.8811.

The College serves about 1,800 *community education* students each term. The enrollment for spring 2014 in the *community education* program was 1,859 students.

Gender

The College's *community education* student population is composed of 24 percent men and 74 percent women. (Three percent of students did not report this information.)

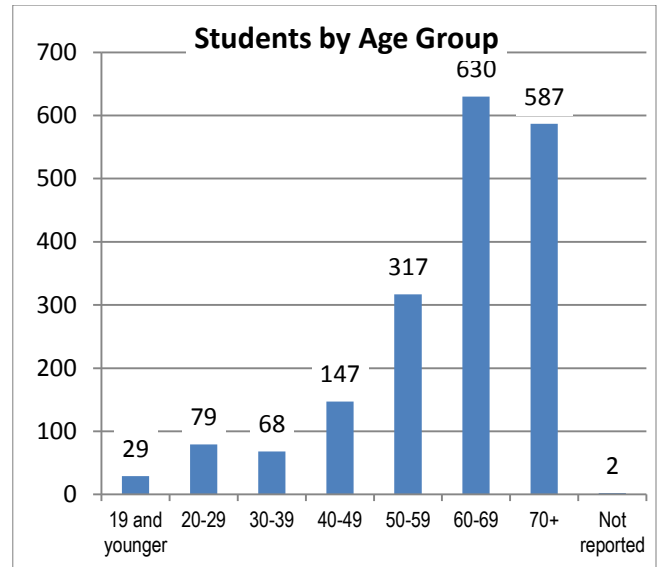
Geographic Location

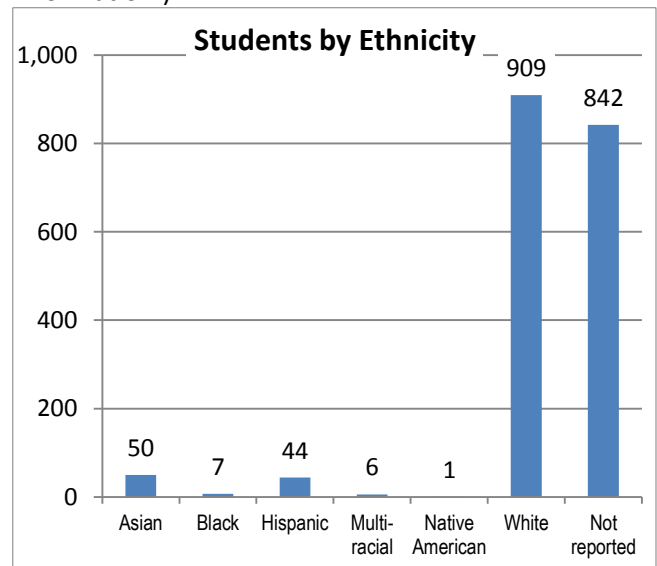
Age of Students

Ninety-four percent of the College's *community education* students are 30 years of age or older. The average age of *community education* students is 62 years; the youngest is 13 and the oldest is over 80.
