Overview

Established in 1926, College of Marin is located approximately 15 miles north of San Francisco in Marin County. The College consists of two campuses. The 77-acre Kentfield Campus is located in Central Marin; the 333-acre Indian Valley Campus is located in North Marin. There are 318 permanent staff and faculty and the College also employs many part-time employees.

The College offers more than 50 degree programs leading to either an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree. Over 20 Certificates of Achievement in various specialties are offered. The College has established over 200 articulation and transfer agreements with institutions of higher education including the University of California, the California State University, and private colleges.

Program Overview

College of Marin offers credit, noncredit, and feebased courses.

Noncredit courses and fee-based courses are shortterm, not given for credit, and not graded. For information on COM's fee-based courses, please consult the community education schedule or call 415.485.9305.

Courses that can be applied towards a certificate, a degree, or transfer to another college are offered through the College's credit program. Many services such as counseling, financial aid, and job placement are available. Please see the credit/noncredit class schedule for a listing of classes or call 415.457.8811.

In spring 2014, a total of 6,305 students enrolled in the College's credit program consisting of 935 credit classes (752 at the Kentfield Campus; 183 at the Indian Valley Campus). The majority of these students attended College of Marin part-time.

The College's credit student population is composed of 41 percent men and 58 percent women. (One percent of students did not report this information.)


Geographic Location


Age of Students
